1. Why are we studying healing?
2. What are you coming with expectation to receive from it?
3. Pair off with someone (or even a full family discussion) and discuss your thoughts concerning these following points we have covered.
  - Mercy & Grace (what are they, how do they come, how are they similar and how do they differ...etc.)
  - How does God consider the weak and sickly. If looking through His eyes, what would you see - how would you feel?
  - What is unbelief? Why does God say it is evil (Heb. 3:12)?
  - What character traits and actions accompanied those who were healed in Jesus' ministry?
  - Are all of those necessary (think through this).
  - What is the real meaning of Js. 1:5-7 and how does this affect our understanding of healing?
  - Discuss the things which stand out to you in the healing stories we have covered so far... Matt. 9:19-31; Matt. 15:22-28; Matt. 20:29-34; Luke 17:11-19; Luke 6:17-19; Phil. 2:27.
  - Is faith more than convincing yourself that something is true? Explain?
  - Talk about how faith comes - not the patterned short answer quoted from Rom. 10:17, but what Rom. 9:30-10:21 is talking about.
  - How does faith speak?
  - How do the following passages address our part in responding to the word that is near us - Heb. 1:1,2; 2:1; 3:1-19; 4:1-13
